Canadian Committee Update

A survey went out to all Canadian RCST® members to collect information about who was successfully having clients receive sessions paid for by extended Health care companies. Our survey showed that BCST sessions have been covered by health insurance plans. However, often the clients needed to advocate for this coverage.

Trademark Reminder

There are other associations in existence that register practitioners and use RCST. The trademark symbol ® serves to distinguish us in the marketplace as highly trained Biodynamic Craniosacral Therapy practitioners. It indicates that the mark has been awarded to the user and is protected by copyright law. It is required to be used with the RCST designation: thus, RCST®. The ® need only appear with RCST once in an article and once on a web page, even if RCST appears more often.

Also, the approved name of our modality is: Biodynamic Craniosacral Therapy or Craniosacral Biodynamics. If you are using the RCST® designation, please use the term Biodynamic Craniosacral Therapy or Craniosacral Biodynamics, not simply craniosacral therapy.

STANDARDS FOR PRACTICE AND CORE CURRICULUM AND COMPETENCIES

Standards of Practice / Core Curriculum and Competencies Revision Update

During our last BCTA/NA annual in-person Board meeting at the beautiful Shambhala Mountain Retreat Center in Colorado, a different definition of the Standards of Practice content emerged.

In the process of creating a legislative packet which includes the Standard of Practice, we researched other organizations standards. This research revealed a typical SOP is a short document listing the validity of our "Right to Practice."

From this research it was evident that two types of documents were needed. One, the shorter SOP document geared for the legislative "right to practice" packet. This SOP has brief summaries of our style of craniosacral work and is heavily laden with ethics related content that will assure the US legislators that BCST is a safe modality and poses no threat to the public and BCTA/NA is a self-governing organization and should be exempt from the binding laws meant for the massage industry. For our Canadian members, content specific to those issues are in process.

Additionally, a Core Curriculum and Competencies (CCC) was created to specify the minimum requirements of a BCST foundation training.

The revised edition of the Standards of Practice (SOP), Code of Ethics (CoE) and a newly created Core Curriculum and Competencies (CCC) document are in their final editing phase. Thank you to our teachers, Board and membership for sharing your feedback on these documents. Once the final editing has been completed, they will be ready for Board approval. We expect the documents be ready for publication by summer.

We are deeply grateful for all the feedback and collaborative efforts. The newly created SOP and CCC are living documents. The BOD and SOP/CCC Committee recommends that they be reviewed at regular intervals.

Rebekah Crown, RCST® joined as Chair of the SOP/CCC committee in October. Current committee members are: Felicity Bensch, Gerry Clow, Denise Giusti, Elizabeth Hammond, and Mimi Ikle-khalsa.

FINANCES

2018 Financial Summary

Financial Report 2017

Financial Position

For the year ending December 31, 2017, our net assets (reserves) increased by \$17,802 to \$84,735 with a checking account balance of \$79,735. This reserve is necessary to cover:

- Expenses associated with holding the biennial Teachers' Meeting which will be held following the conference in 2018 and expected to cost approximately \$15,000
- Cover the potential liability to a hotel or conference facility should it be necessary to cancel a future conference after the cancellation dates provided in their contract, which this year could exceed \$54,990
- Pay operating expenses during the 8 months from July through February of the next budget year while membership payments are below current expenses. 74% of our receipts arrive between March and June.

- Give the Board flexibility to adopt demonstration projects and services not anticipated in the budget
- Provide funding that can support the expansion of member services when the opportunity arises.

Statement of Activity Summary

To provide a more useful 2017 versus 2016 comparison of ongoing expenses, receipts and disbursements for the Conference and Scholarship have been excluded from the comparison below and represents activity of the General Operating Fund only. In 2017 the net change in the Conference account was a reduction of \$1,262 with an increase of \$225 in the scholarship fund.

The source 95% of our receipts is membership fees. Of that \$55,260 is from RCST applications and renewals. The only increase (\$10) in RCST renewal fees occurred in 2015 and was accompanied by strategic discounts in application fees to encourage new memberships, so most of the \$8,190 increase over 2016 is a result of membership growth.

The \$3,340 increase in Education fees resulted from the sale of subscriptions paid to access videos of presentations given at the 2016 BOL Conference. This was more than offset by the cost of filming, editing and access which appear in the Webinar expense line in 2016. Although not a net source of revenue yet, we are encouraged by member feedback regarding the quality and usefulness of these videos and see the potential for reaching more members and the public as we go forward.

Supporting that growth in membership the costs of serving prospective and existing members increased \$5,564 over 2016 and represents 27.4% of total expenses.

The services provided through our website have also increased including membership application and renewal, teacher discussion forums, and video access. The design and maintenance of our website and conference video content (Webinars) resulted in 17.5% of our expenses.

Publications (12.5% of the total) provide for annual publication of the Cranial Wave, Newsletter, Class and Workshop promotions, and BCTA/NA logo refinement.

The Annual Board Planning meeting totaled \$8,135 (16.2% of total expenses paying for overnight accommodations, food and travel reimbursement for volunteer Board members to meet face to face and develop plans for the coming year. In 2016 the total (\$20,5778) included the cost of the biennial meeting of BCTA Teachers held between the Board meeting and conference.

Finance (19.8% of the total) includes accounting, financial record archiving, bank fees, credit card processing fees, and filling of state and IRS 990 reports.

Office Expenses (\$1,306), including voice mail, archiving historical records, liability insurance accounted for less than 3% and Other Board Expenses (\$2,006) including representation at the annual Federation of Massage and Bodyworkers meeting, representation at the European Conference totaled 4%.

BCTA/NA has no paid employees. Service contracts extend the capacity of many volunteers providing for administrative, accounting, editing, website, video and design services on an as-needed basis under the oversight of the volunteer Board of Directors.

<u>Business</u>

September 13-14

SOPC: Current status and future:

Based on feedback offered at Ghost Ranch, the Teachers Forum, and research on the documents of other organizations, a decision was made that several documents were needed to meet the needs of BCTA/NA.

Audiences identified that needed documents would include:

- 1. Governmental/ Regulatory Agencies
- 2. Teachers
- 3. Teacher Trainers
- 4. Teacher Assistants
- 5. Students
- 6. Practitioners
- 7. The Public (including prospective clients).

To meet the needs of these groups, we decided to gather, create, and/or revise all the documents that each group would need and to create a packet for each group.

It was decided that the first order of action would be to focus the orientation of the Standard of Practice (SOP) on meeting the needs of practitioners when defending their right to practice. This would be a document important to a number of groups but particularly to Governmental Regulatory Agencies. (Rebecca Crown participated via Skype in two hours of discussion regarding possible content of an SOP and documents.)

The second order of action would be to create an additional document describing BCST's core curriculum and the related practitioner competencies that would express

the minimum requirements in a Foundation training. This document would be called "Core Curriculum and Competencies:" (CCC)

A motion was made and passed that the committee name be retitled to the Standard of Practice and Core Curriculum/Competencies Committee (SPO/CCC) and their commission be redirected to complete <u>two</u> documents, the SOP and CCC Documents. Motion passed contingent on communication with remaining SOPC members.

September 15, 2016 <u>SOP, CCC, Ethics, Packets</u>: BOD members volunteered for various tasks involving these projects.

<u>Conference Center</u>: A discussion was had and a motion made and approved to accept Shambhala Center as the site for the 2020 BCTA/NA Conference.

<u>Financial Report</u>: Fred Snowden presented Financial Report (in above Annual Report). A discussion followed, BOD approved all revisions to the 2017 Budget

<u>Brochure</u>: Edits were discussed with Jared Power via Skype and the committee agreed to complete the project in the next few months.

<u>Teacher Resource Folder and Copyrights</u>: Agreed that professional consultation is needed.

<u>Continuing Education and Advanced Studies Committee:</u> BOD will hold space for addressing Advanced Studies and the possibility of an advanced practitioner title, but this committee is currently suspended and will be reviewed after more pressing needs are met (SOP, CCC, Etc.).

<u>Continuing Education</u>: Discussion about the professional importance of continuing education lead to the decision to add a CE requirement of 7 hours to RCST and Teachers' membership renewal requirements in May of 2019. Further discussion, explanation and roll-out of this requirement will continue.

Conference 2018 FB page and Dropbox: Mimi is tracking this process and will follow up.

<u>Teacher Bio-Pages</u>: Ellen volunteered to create a template. Mimi and Fred will contact Pedro.

Logo Use: Fred and Elizabeth will finalize the terms of use and execute member rollout.

TAC Process: Elizabeth is revising the application process to be clearer.

<u>Seeking feedback on meaningful member perks</u>: Pam Hower will put out an e-blast asking for members' ideas and will identify the top 10 for the BOD's consideration.

Expansion of private teacher forum: Elizabeth will follow-up after completion of other BOD priorities (SOP, CCC and other document work).

Member Only Section on website: Fred and Pedro studying this option.
